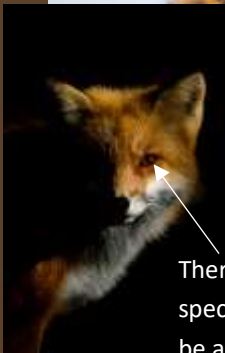


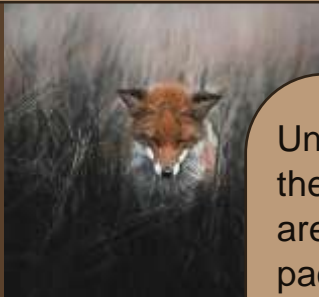
5 facts about foxes you didn't know

predators

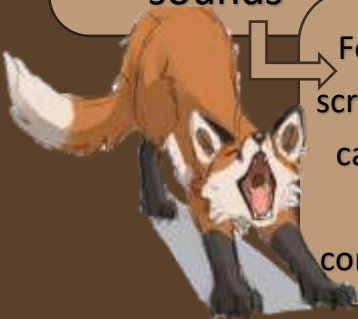
Foxes are considered to be solitary animals



Unlike other members of the canine family, foxes are not considered to be pack animals. Foxes tend to live by themselves or in small family groups called a “skulk”, which typically includes the mother fox and around 6 cubs.

Foxes can make over 40 different sounds

Foxes can make variation of screams, barks, and howls that can range from high pitched tones to lower tones to communicate different things.



A fox has excellent hearing

It can hear a mouse squeak 100 ft. Away and will dig in dirt or snow to catch prey
